Behnaz Ahmadian - "Petals and Paper" Saturday, February 17, 2024 -- 9am - 3pm Ascension Lutheran Church 1701 W. Caley Ave. Littleton, CO 80120

She likes to work with many different mediums but the main medium she works in is acrylic. Behnaz is very fascinated with pattern and color and incorporates them in her paintings.

Embark on a captivating journey into the art of paper collage with a special focus on painted papers. This workshop, "Petals and Paper" invites participants to explore the synergy between paint, paper, and mixed media as they create a stunning bouquet of flowers.

This workshop is designed for artists of all levels, offering a unique opportunity to combine the expressive qualities of both painting and paper collage.



## Lee Wasilik - "Everything You Need to Know about Watercolor"

Saturday, March 16, 2024 -- 9am - 3pm Ascension Lutheran Church 1701 W. Caley Ave. Littleton, CO 80120



This is a hands-on workshop designed for the beginning watercolorist but can be a valuable review for the more experienced artist as well. It will stress the importance of good supplies, paper, paint, and brushes.

At the beginning, we will look at some examples of good and bad watercolors and point out the most common mistakes made by beginners.

Participants will explore the various ways of applying paint to paper; wet on wet, wet on damp, wet on dry, etc. We will look at the various brush strokes and learn how to combine them to form recognizable objects. We will look at the difference between hard and soft edges and how to create them.



Finally, we will look at some special watercolor techniques. Using reference of their choice, students will apply what they have learned to create their own masterpieces.

Last, there will be an evaluation of the finished work by the instructor and the students.



Artists will be guided from start to finish through group and individual attention by beginning with painting a background of skies, fields, or mountains. Then, add aspens with a palette knife for an amazing acrylic landscape artwork. Composition and how to know when your artwork is complete will be included. Candace's teaching style is engaging, inspiring, and most of all fun!
