Colorado artist Lance Green will teach a one-day workshop emphasizing modern expressionism. This one-day session will enable participants to awaken new avenues of color and self-expression.

Lance is a native Coloradan, but it was in New Mexico, Arizona, and Los Angeles, California that he became immersed in native art and Latin culture. Greatly influenced by the late contemporary master Fritz Scholder, with whom he did a series of one-on-one workshops in the late sixties, Lance now paints in his studio in Manitou Springs, Colorado.
