For ten minutes or so we were both magically transported back in time.

I have always been grateful for that meeting. Mrs. Price passed away a couple of years later. But I will always have the fond memories of the special teacher who had a profound effect on my life.

I'll bet you have memories of your special teacher too.

No works copied from magazines, calendars, printed sources are acceptable.

No artwork that has previously been entered into art shows in Littleton in the past year is eligible as the Library wishes a fresh show. No paintings can be removed before the end of the show. Please, no sawtooth hangers. Have sturdy, nice frames with wire hangers. Wraparound canvases are OK. No painting that won an award in a previous HFAG Show is eligible to be entered. No repeat images (photos, silkscreen, etchings, wood prints) are acceptable to be entered.

JUROR; BOB GRAY He works in many medias, has experience and education to judge every art style and technique.

Oversize works may not be hung, as space will be allotted by the hanging committee, and their word is final.

On the back of your artwork, each piece should have this information:

Your Name, Your Phone Number Title of artwork
Media - watercolor, oil, mixed, acrylic, collage, etc. Value (for insurance)

Please plan to attend the reception, and bring yummy finger foods to share. Beverage, plates, and napkins will be provided.

Painting a Series

All established artists paint in series. Find out why you should, too! It will stretch your creative thinking and flex your painting techniques. And it will also answer that nagging question, "What subject shall I paint next?"



Dean Adams'



"Heart" series

Guild member Dean Adams will kick off our season with a workshop on producing a series of paintings that share a single theme or subject, such as in the above series... the heart.

About the Artist:

Dean is originally from Detroit, where he studied art at Wayne State University. Upon graduation he took a job at an advertising agency and moved up the ranks to become an art director, broadcast producer, and creative director. He moved to Denver in 1979 and joined an advertising agency as creative director.

Dean also taught graphic design at the Colorado Institute of Art for several years.

"I really don't have a particular style of painting. Most of my paintings are metaphorically inspired. I think that this comes from my advertising background, where the message was the most important element and the art simply reinforced that message. It's a challenge to take a word, phrase or broad idea and externalize it on a canvas."

Supply List & Preparation:

- Bring at least three or more small, prepared canvases or multiple sheets of heavy watercolor paper. You could prepare a few canvases primed in white and some in black or gray or any other color as a starting point - just to jump-start the "old creative juices".
- Acrylic paints are ideal because of their fast drying time, but bring any painting medium you prefer and any other supplies you enjoy using.
- What subject matter should you choose? This is totally up to you, but be sure to make it SIMPLE, because the goal is for you to paint three or more paintings during the workshop, which is the main reason small canvases are recommended.
- Each painting you do will be of the same theme or the same subject of your choosing. For example, you could decide to paint a favorite object - a coffee cup or animal or flower. For inspiration, you could bring the object to the workshop (but probably best to leave any animals at home...). Or you could paint an idea or feeling such as love, happy, silly, triumph, etc. Or you could choose something graphic like stars, circles, squares, etc.



Whatever subject you choose becomes the THEME for your series. We will then play with different looks or styles that express that theme or object in different ways. It will be great fun, and you will find out just how inspiring and liberating it is to be able to... paint it again and again!

Because the Senator's office and conference rooms have 25 ft ceilings, they would like large pieces of artwork with a minimum height of 36 inches (including frame).
