Hello Heritage Members and Supporters-

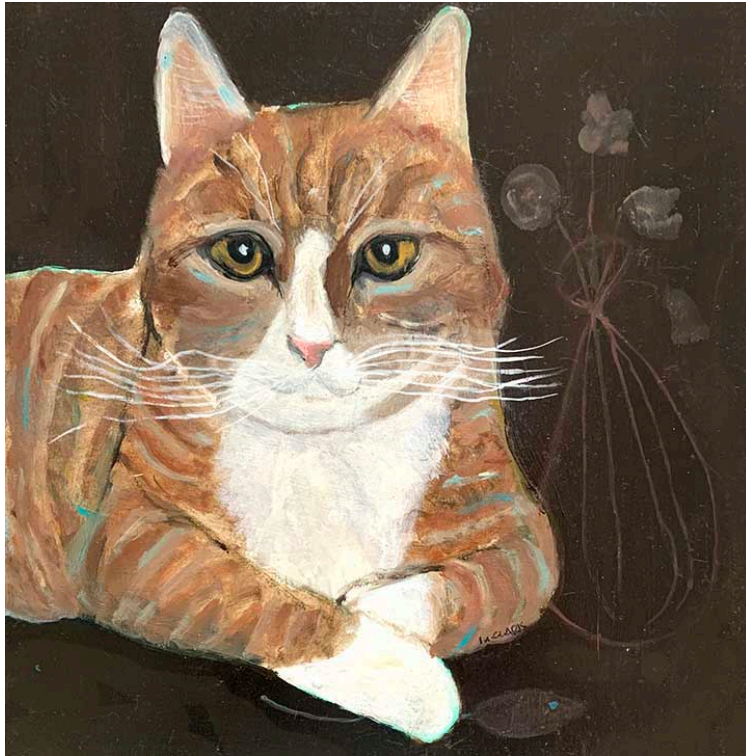

*Saturday, January 22, 2022 -- 9am - 12pm*

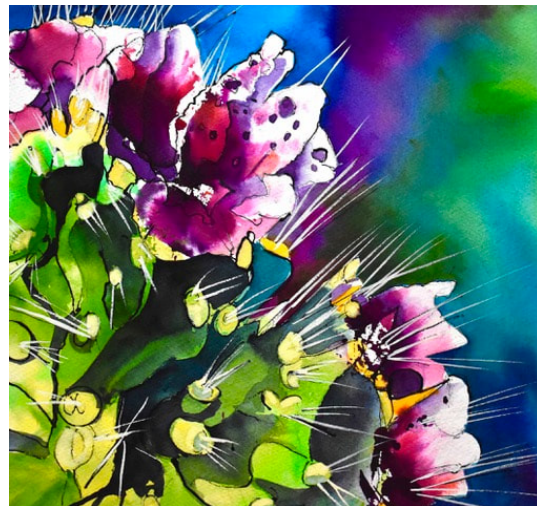
*Maximum 12 students*
