

Biography Patricia Barr Clarke

Patricia Barr Clarke paints impressionistic watercolors with vivid colors on location around the world. She has lived in Costa Rica, Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Spain for extended periods of time and most recently has traveled to Chile, Spain and Curacao to paint en plein air.

Now living in the Denver area, she is a signature member of the Colorado Watercolor Society, Plein Air Artists of Colorado, former president of the Park Hill Art Club, and member of the Heritage Art Guild. She studied art at the University of Kansas and the University of Michigan, with a BA from Kansas University, and an MA from The American University of Cairo, Egypt.

She teaches watercolor classes at The Art Garage in Denver, workshops for Denver art guilds and groups in Colorado, New Mexico, and Curacao.

Her gallery representations have included Artist in Residence at Mill Gallery, Santa Fe, New Mexico, Santa Fe Fine Art Brokerage in New Mexico, Plein Air Curacao Maritime Museum in Willemstad, Curacao, Vail Aspen Treasures, Frame of Mind, Denver and Saxon Mountain Gallery in Georgetown, Colorado.

Her work is in the Kirkland Museum of Fine and Decorative Art, Denver, and in private collections of former governor Bill Ritter, Fort Restaurant owner Sam Arnold and the Alexandria Library in Egypt.
