2021 HEALING ARTS SHOW

Entry Deadline August 16, 2021 10 pm



Important Note: We were just informed that some requirements for the Healing Arts Show when it held in the hospital venue are not necessary for the show at the Credit Union. Paintings do not have to be 16" x 20" and do not require dark frames. Painted wrapped canvas at least 1.5" deep is also acceptable.

The next Healing Arts Show with work by Heritage Fine Arts Guild members will be held at the Denver Community Credit Union September 1, 2021- November 30, 2021. This call for entry is open ONLY to Heritage members. There is no entry fee. Approximately 20 paintings will be selected for the show, and they can be for sale. As in past years, the Director of the Healing Arts Program, Mary Williams, will jury the show. Paintings will be exhibited at the Credit Union, 101 W. Mineral Ave in Littleton, CO 80120.

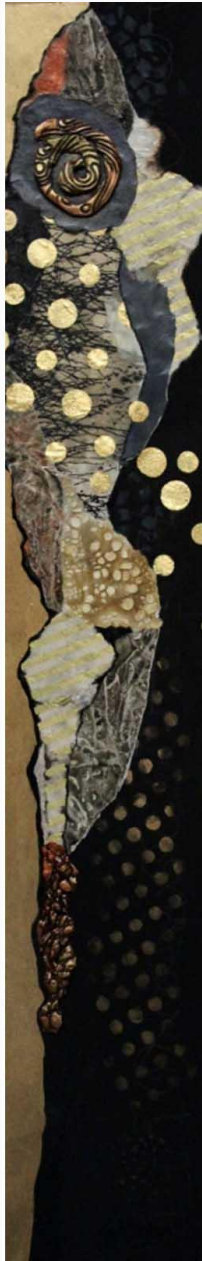

Do you like messing around in your studio? I mean with art supplies. Let me show you how you can do the “Messaround”. It's kind of like doodling, but with collage materials instead of a pen or pencil. I will supply many **mixed media materials**, and you will make some in the class. Learn the secret to perfect composition in your messaround. You are welcome to search your stash of mixed media materials and bring some of your own doodads and stuff. You will make one fabulous 4" x 14" abstract in this class and have fun doin' it!

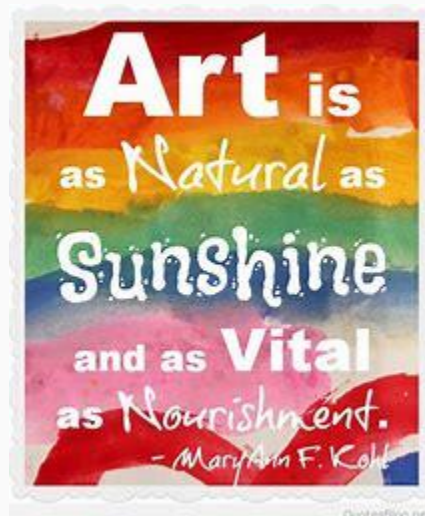
Materials provided by instructor:

- Golden gloss medium, gel medium and fluid acrylics to share
- wood substrates, red rosin paper
- Plaster of Paris, air dry clay
- burlap
- Tyvek, and more

Supply list for students to bring:

- Your favorite acrylic paints (or use shared Golden Fluid Acrylics)
- Short Handled Nylon Brushes (3/4 inch flat, #6 round) suitable for w/c and acrylic
- Spray water bottle, paper towels, palette (I use disposable styrofoam plates)
- Small palette knife, scissors
- large water container
