


June 8, 2022, Meeting Information

May Highlights

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Paint with Phyllis Vandehaar Saturday, May 28, 2022



Phyllis Vandehaar led a fun and engaging workshop where the participants were asked to stretch their imagination, combining different art materials. Phyllis provided the participants with three different color papers with spider-like webbing sprayed on them. The first exercise was watercolor on white paper to create a non-objective design. The second was a gray paper used to create a theme in pastels. The third, a black piece of paper was used to create a realistic or abstract theme using torn paper. Throughout the workshop Phyllis used demonstrations and her own artwork to explain the how and why of using certain techniques. In addition, Phyllis provided encouragement and suggestions to the participants on how they could improve the artwork. This was an educational workshop with lots of new and interesting techniques.

2022 Healing Arts Show Call for Entry

Our next Healing Arts Show at Littleton Hospital will run July 1- Sep 30. Paintings will be exhibited in the gallery next to the Hospital's main lobby. Littleton Hospital is located at 7700 S Broadway, Littleton, CO 80122.

PLEASE READ THE REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY SO YOUR PAINTINGS CAN BE ACCEPTED FOR JURYING

Requirements:

- Subject should be in keeping with the "Healing Arts" theme such as depicting nature, something beautiful or something positive.
- The painting plus any matting must be 16" x 20".
- A black or dark brown frame is required OR wrapped and painted canvas or board at least 1.5" thick.
- Hanging hardware with a wire is required.
- All artworks must be the original work of the person submitting, i.e.,

- Artwork that has not been done in or originating from a class, workshop or demonstration.
- Artwork that has not been copied from another artist's work or medium, e.g., photographs, calendars, graphics, prints. With respect to copyright laws, it is recommended that all references be the artist's own photographs and sketches.
- Artwork that has won a juror award may not be entered in another Guild show.
- Artwork that has been in any Guild show may not be entered in another Guild show for one year.
- Reproductions are not allowed, e.g., photographic prints, giclee or iris print, computer printouts, multi-graph prints. Photographs or digitally modified photographs are not accepted.
- You may submit up to 3 entries.
- IMPORTANT: Label your painting images for entry with Your name, Title, Medium, <u>Image</u> size (not framed size), and Price or NFS. Label you physical paintings for delivery with Your name and Title.
- There is no fee to enter.
- Sales are handled by the artist (you will be contacted if a painting is sold) and a 20% commission to the Hospital Foundation is required on all sales.

Dates:

- Deadline for entry online is June 24 at 10 pm.
- We were unable to reserve the meeting room at the Bemis Library for inperson jurying, so painting selection will take place online. We will send the registration website as soon as it is available.
- Painting delivery is 10 am on June 30 at the Littleton Hospital Gallery.
- Painting pickup Sep 30, 10:30 a.m. at the Littleton Hospital Gallery.

In 2022, BMoCA celebrates 50 years of artistic innovation and creative experiences. Thanks to our incredible community, the museum is looking forward to a bright future. Your involvement with BMoCA has been instrumental, and we are grateful.

Over the last several years we have been conceptualizing how BMoCA can continue fulfilling its mission to inspire creativity and foster community for many years to come. We are excited to announce that we are now ready to engage the community in the

process of envisioning a new BMoCA facility in North Boulder.

Our goal is to create a state-of-the-art museum that will serve the Boulder community by:

- Strengthening our impact
- Amplifying the voices of artists
- Building community

The potential site for BMoCA in North Boulder is on a parcel of land bounded by Violet Avenue, Broadway, and 10th Street. The new museum will be an arts anchor for a mixed-use "creative campus" envisioned by Boulder-based <u>Emerald Development</u> as a site for inclusive spaces for artist studios, housing, retail, and open space. We are excited to participate in an extensive community engagement process to further define the creative campus. The process will be led by Emerald Development and facilitated by consultants <u>Centro</u> and <u>Ford Momentum</u>, who have worked extensively with arts districts and are committed to accessibility and inclusion.

Additionally, BMoCA is working with the community to determine the museum's site amenities, general design, and community programming. BMoCA needs your input about our new facility, and we hope you will join the conversation. Your ideas and feedback will be critical in shaping the museum's future.
